### You Know You're a Naturalist When....

Have you ever been awakened very early in the morning by the dawn chorus, when the birds have been roused and are all singing at the same time and it's barely light outside? That's my spring alarm clock. One morning I was lying there, still in a fog of semi-conciousness, when without realizing it. I was identifying the birds I could hear. After a few minutes, when I became more fully awake, it occurred to me that what I was doing was probably unusual. After all, what kind of person would automatically start identifying bird calls while still basically unconcious? Or, who cares about bird calls anyway?

So I started pondering this. Most people I come in contact with look at the world a lot differently. Take my neighbor for example. He once asked me about those weeds in my



front yard. "Weeds! Where?", I#hought. I immediately turned to that patch of bermuda grass I had been trying to eliminate. I thought it might be coming back to life again. It tends to do that it seems. But no, by weeds he meant the big bluestem, millkweed, black-eyed susan, and other wild flowers I let grow in my yard. My neighbor held a pretty typical belief. If it's not bermuda or fescue, and you can't buy it at a plant nursery, it's a weed.

Or, you may be one of people who fit the pattern I was seeing emerge. We are naturalists of course! And I realized that being a naturalist isn't necessarily a job title or a scientist in a jungle somewhere. It's folks like you and me who still have that child-like fascination with the natural world around us. We are more intrigued by a spider web wet with morning dew, with a rainbow streaked across it, than we are a shopping mall.

So I started wondering what other things naturalists do that identify them as such. Well, you know you're a naturalist if your vacation photos cut off a family member in order to center the adjacent flower, snake, or rock formation. You know you're a naturalist if your vacation destinations are national forests or parks instead of cities which must be avoided if at all possible. Or how about this one? You know you're a naturalist if your freezer contents include a roadkill you picked up for the nature center's study skin

collection. Do you brake for box turtles and move them off the road? You might be a naturalist. We could all take a look at ourselves and the things we do. There are a lot of naturalists reading this article right now. Are you one?

#### Redbud Valley and Oxley Nature Center will be closed for the following holiday: Sunday, July 4.



A \$2 parking fee per car (for the general public) will be charged on weekends from April through October when entering Mohawk Park. Members of Oxley get in free. The west gate will be closed on weekends April-October.

#### OXLEY AND REDBUD HOURS:

The gates at Oxley Nature Center are open daily, with the exception of most City holidays, from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. At Oxley, you may park outside the gates from 7:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. to walk the trails even when the gates are closed.

At Redbud Valley Nature Preserve, the gates are open Wednesdays through Sundays, from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. You may not hop the fence when the Nature Preserve is closed: on Mondays or Tuesdays, on City holidays, before 8:00 a.m., or after 5:00 p.m.

### Oxley Nature Center's 4th Annual Butterfly Count -- Tuesday, July 6, 2004

Butterfly watchers needed! The 30th annual North American Butterfly Association (NABA) 4th of July Butterfly Count tracks butterfly populations in Canada, the United States and Mexico. For the 4th year we will census populations within 7.5 miles of Oxley Nature Center. Help us spot and count butterflies anytime between 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on July 6. Please call to sign up. The \$3 fee will be waived if you sign up before 4:30 p.m. on July 3. You may also contribute by counting butterflies in your own yard.

#### Perseid Meteor Watch

The best time to view the Perseid meteor shower is after 2:00 a.m., and you will see more "shooting stars" if you find a good dark site 30 miles from city lights.
